GCA may have started out as a simple summer camp, but our camp program is anything but simple now.

Thanks, in part, to ParticipAction, our clients enjoyed trips to SkyZone trampoline park, weekly private pool rentals, and visits to museums, High Park, Riverdale Zoo, movie theatres, parks and more.

We take pride in getting our clients out into the community and ensuring their caregivers know that their loved ones are well cared for.

190 of whom received funded or subsidized programming. The program grew by 153% & 15,600 hours of respite care were provided.

RESPITE

98% of caregivers recommend GCA, and 75% report that they experienced reduced stress. We are proud to make a meaningful impact on GTA families.

Clients such as Pavlina and her son, Michael, found a supportive community with us. Michael thrived in the respite program, enhancing both his communication skills and his confidence and Pavlina thrived with a chance to recharge. Pavlina highlighted the staff's dedication.

AUTISM WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT HUB

This innovative program was developed to support mutual success for neurodiverse employees and their employers.

ESSENTIAL SKILLS PROGRAM

A GAME CHANGER FOR LIFE SKILLS DEVELOPMENT

Launched in winter 2023 and tailored for children ages 7-10.

ESSENTIAL SKILLS PROGRAM

Launched winter 2023, GCA introduced our Essential Skills program, designed to foster independence and inclusion in daily activities at home and in the community. Tailored for children aged 7-10, including those non-verbal or with limited communication skills, our program has already been a game-changer.

We simulate real-life scenarios like household chores, haircuts, and doctor's appointments, preparing children to navigate these experiences with confidence. Parents have already told us of the changes they are noticing in their children. We are making a difference.

"We are so happy to see the progress the kids have made in this program. One parent shared with us the incredible news that their child sat through a full 30 minute haircut, something that was a real challenge before. SONDERLY TRAINING

Collaborating with educators, clinical experts, and individuals on the spectrum, Sonderly's training builds the skills within the educational community that allow for greater acceptance and support for neurodiverse students.

Achieving a 98% recommendation rate from users highlights the quality and relevance of Sonderly's offerings. Participants particularly value the real-life examples and practical strategies offered. One said:

"I'm so pleased with the presentation and content of the courses I have taken through this program. I feel more confident and well versed in the many areas of ASD as a result of the brilliant material your courses cover."

We launched seven live and on-demand new courses, saw 10,911 course enrollments across a range of topics, and reached 117 organizations. This growth in offerings and user base has empowered more teachers to create safer and more inclusive school environments for our community.

The expansion resulted in an 18% revenue increase from last year. These funds directly support capacity growth at Geneva Centre for Autism, enabling us to offer more programs for autistic children and adults.

Our priority remains to support educators in building neuroinclusive classrooms, so those on the spectrum can thrive. We are proud that our world-class training is having a direct impact.
